















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
ENTRY: Registration, Onboarding, Enrollment to Completion of first 12-hours of instruction

Implement targeted outreach and marketing

- All consortium members to contract with N&R Publications for development of media toolkits for business and community partners, tribal council, SDWP, and community colleges
- GAE contract with *Full Capacity* for development of member-specific, strategic communications plan to boost brand awareness and enrollments, as well as a strategy for a clear brand architecture among all of the ERAE members

Expand system of professional learning

• Focus on transitions - mini-conference planned for March 2022

Engage students strategically

• Developed new Onboarding tools for students to get connected faster and more effectively





Implement five clearly mapped training and education paths

- Hosted Training and Career Expo Introduced ~70 students to college and career paths
- Graduated first cohort of Culinary Arts students in new Earn-and-Learn Program
- Created direct employment paths for two programs (HR; Ship Repair)
- Host college tours (starting January 2023)
- Co-host Career Expo February 2023

Support student persistence and transitions

- Five workgroups aligned with plan's five objectives began to evaluate impact and outcomes of plan implementation
- Task force established to increase transitions to college created and began to execute project plan

Facilitate matriculation for adult education students (150 students in 2022/23)


Accomplishments
