## STEP 1: PARTICIPATE IN A REQUIRED CAREER TRAINING ORIENTATION

Visit Grossmont Adult Ed to register for an upcoming orientation. Orientations occur weekly, are offered in person or online by Zoom, and are approximately one hour in length. Attending an orientation is required before registering into any Career Training program. Attending the orientation will familiarize you with our class offerings; financial, academic, and other supports; and job preparation opportunities.

## Accounting

Mo & We, 6 pm - 9 pm

16 weeks. Gain the fundamental knowledge of bookkeeping and accounting practices that are the cornerstone of most businesses (GAPP). Acquire basic MS Office Excel skills and develop organizational skills required to create balance sheets, income statements, cash flow, and more.

## Human Resources & Finance Fundamentals

### Tu We Th. Times TBD

12 weeks. Learn business and finance industry terminology, gain professional writing proficiency, and develop interpersonal skills to prepare for a variety of career opportunities in finance and human resources. Participate in employment interviews with local business partners.

## Office Professional Training Bootcamp

## Mo Tu We, 5 pm - 8:30 pm

4 weeks. Gain the skills necessary to perform office tasks encountered on a daily basis. Practice basic skills in Microsoft Office programs and Google Drive and prepare for next pathway classes, a college class, or employment in the field.

## Office Professional Certificate Training

## Mo Tu We, 5 pm - 8:45 pm

12 weeks. Prepare for the ever-changing, cloud-based office environment, working with Microsoft Office programs (Word, Excel, & PowerPoint) as well as Google Drive functions. Gain the skills needed to pass the Office Professional Certificate test, included in this class.

## Income Tax Preparation

(Fall Semester Only)

## Tu & Th, 6 pm - 9 pm

14 weeks. Learn how to prepare taxes like a pro. The class includes the required hours of Federal and California instruction. Successful completion of this class allows for registration with the California Tax Education Council (CTEC), which is required to be a paid tax preparer in the State of California.

## **STEP 2:** REGISTER FOR A CAREER TRAINING PROGRAM

Registration for programs will open online prior to the start of each class. Registration is a first come first serve process and is only open to students who have attended a Career Training orientation.

## QuickBooks

## Tu Th, 6 pm - 9 pm

16 weeks. Gain the skills needed for using QuickBooks effectively in this class for beginning and intermediate QuickBooks students. Use QuickBooks Online to set up a new company, customers, vendors, and banking; to correct common errors; and to deepen understanding of QuickBooks. Prepare for taking the Intuit QuickBooks Online Certification test to enhance your career portfolio. Prerequisites: Bookkeeping or accounting experience and basic computer skills.

## Typing Certificate

Typing certification tests are offered weekly. Please check the website for test dates.

## REAL ESTATE

Successful completion of three real estate classes is required to take the CA Real Estate Exam.

### CA Real Estate Practice

### Th, 6 pm - 9 pm

16 weeks. Prepare for aspects of buying and selling a home, product knowledge, filling out contracts and disclosure, marketing listings, financing the purchase, and completing and closing the transaction. This class meets the California Bureau of Real Estate class requirement.

## CA Real Estate Principles

## We, 6 pm - 9 pm

16 weeks. Prepare to pass the California Real Estate Exam. Topics covered include the nature of real estate, ethics, law contracts, finance, taxation, appraisal, and property management. This class meets the California Bureau of Real Estate class requirement.

### CA Real Estate Law

## Tu, 6 pm - 9 pm

16 weeks. Gain a deep understanding of legal descriptions, how ownership is acquired and conveyed, California license law, fair housing law, consumer protection law, contract law, and real estate contracts and disclosures. The class meets the California Bureau of Real Estate class requirement.

## ■ TRANSPORTATION

## Class B Entry Level Driver Training - Theory

### Tu We Th, 4:45 pm - 7:45 pm

2 weeks. Gain the skills required to obtain a CLP (Commercial Learners Permit) and meet the Education Code school bus requirements for original and renewal classroom training provided by a State Certified School Bus Driver Instructor. Under new Federal requirements, this class meets the prerequisite for commercial class and school bus original and renewal class.

## Commercial Class B License - Behind The Wheel

## Tu We Th, 4:45 pm - 7:45 pm Sat, 1 pm - 4 pm

12 weeks. Participate in the Entry-Level Driver Training class (open range and private road) for the Minimum Federal Curricula Requirements of the US Department of Transportation FMCSA (Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration) and to become a professional Commercial Class B Driver with Passenger and Tanker endorsements. Prerequisites: ELDT Theory, DOT Physical and DOT Drug Test. \* DOT drug test must be submitted to a specific facility. See notes under online registration, in "view."

## Truck Driver Training - Concrete Mixer Truck

### Sa, 8 am - 4 pm

4 weeks, 32-hours. Train to drive, maintain and safely navigate a concrete mixer truck at a construction site. Safety protocols, ability to read meters and gauges, and ability to properly operate the vehicle at a job site will be taught. Learn about the concrete industry and the high paying jobs available. Recommended: Students should have a current class-B License with the Tanker Endorsement.

## Original School Bus Driver

### Tu We Th, 9 am - 2:30 pm

2 weeks. Cover all units required in the School Bus Driver Classroom manual and provided by a State Certified Instructor. Receive T-01 verification of training and test preparation for the CHP Application and testing processes. Meets all Education code 40082 classroom requirements. Prerequisites: ELDT-Theory. Prerequisite can be waived upon verification of ELDT theory training given by a state certified instructor. Must register in person to provide training verification.

## School Bus Driver Renewal

## Tu We Th, 9:45 am - 1 pm

2 weeks. Join the renewal training provided by a state certified instructor and meet all Education Code 40085, 40085.5, and 40086 requirements for School Bus Drivers that are in the fifth training period, pending school bus certificate expiration. ELDT training is not required for those seeking in-service training to maintain their school bus driver certificate. Prerequisites: ELDT-Theory \* Prerequisite can be waived upon verification of ELDT theory training given by a state certified instructor. Must register in person to provide training verification.

## CULINARY ARTS & HOSPITALITY

## Culinary Arts

### TBC

16 weeks. Train in a state-of-the-art facility and learn the fundamental culinary and customer service skills needed to work in San Diego's hospitality and tourism industry. Topics include fundamental food preparation techniques, health, safety and sanitation guidelines and customer service training. Receive the County of SD Food Handler Training and Certificate after successful test completion.

## Food Handler Training

## Offered multiple times each semester

All persons employed in any job where food is served are required to take Food Handlers Training and pass the test for the Food Handler Certificate.

## EDUCATION

## Paraeducator Training

## Mo We, $5\ pm-8\ pm$

8 weeks. Students develop an understanding of paraeducator responsibilities in the learning environment, the laws that govern special education, and best practices for working with students with disabilities. Learn about environmental supports, classroom accommodations, and modifications that students may need to be successful.



Women are strongly encouraged to participate in the Construction & Manufacturing classes.

## CONSTRUCTION & MANUFACTURING

## Construction Trades Pre-Apprenticeship

### Tu & Th, 5 pm - 9 pm

16 weeks. Explore in-depth building trades, occupational skills and workplace standards and conduct, framing and drywall, electrical, plumbing, blueprint reading and estimation, hand and power tools, surveying, tile and painting, HVAC, and finish carpentry. Strengthen problem solving and communication skills needed on the worksite. Prepare for apprenticeships by following the nationally recognized MC3 curriculum, including OSHA 10 training and testing.

## Welding

GTAW: Gas Tungsten Arc Welding (TIG) SMAW: Shield Metal Arc Welding (stick/arc) GMAW: Gas Metal Arc Welding (MIG)

## Mo-Th, 4 pm - 8 pm and Fr, 4 pm - 9 pm

16 weeks. Learn how to master welding safety, personal protection equipment, basic equipment set up and repair, and methods and techniques in each discipline.

Note: The GTAW class includes basic electrical theory in GTAW in preparation for testing to AWS D1.3 structural or AWS D9.1 sheet metal welding criteria. Optional processes may include AC aluminum welding and tube notching/welding.



## MEDICAL CAREERS

Offered only at the Health Occupations Center. Orientation is required. Registration fees are low and cover the cost of supplies.

## Certified Nurse Assistant (CNA)

Mo-Th, 7:30 am - 3 pm OR Tu & Th, 7 am - 3:30 pm OR Mo-Th, 4 - 8 pm

10 or 16 weeks. CA Department of Public Health (CDPH) certification. A CNA works under a nurse in direct patient care. Learn the skills necessary to work in hospitals or long-term care facilities.

## Emergency Medical Technician (EMT)

### Mo & Tu, 8 am - 4:30 pm

13 weeks. National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians (NREMT) certification. Learn how to assess a patient's condition at the scene of an accident, transport patients to the hospital, and utilize emergency equipment correctly.

## Healthcare Interpreting (CHIA)

## Tu & Th, 6 - 9 pm

18 weeks. CA Healthcare Interpreter Association (CHIA) certification. Become knowledgeable about medical terminology and interpreting in the healthcare environment. Learn about the role of the healthcare interpreter and ethical decision making.

## Registered Dental Assistant (RDA)

## Mo-Th, 7:30 am - 4:00 pm

18 weeks. Licensed registration with the Dental Board of CA. Learn all aspects of working in a dental office and assisting the dentist. Learn how to take x-rays, to make crowns, and to care for patients. Prerequisite: High school diploma or equivalent.

## Medical Assistant Clinical & Administrative

Mo, 9 am - 2 pm, Tu & We, 8 am - 3 pm Mo-Th, 4 - 8:45pm

18 weeks. California Certifying Board for Medical Assistants (CCBMA) certification. Administrative and clinical procedures are taught for direct patient care in a doctor's office. Skills include vitals assessment, assisting physicians during medical procedures, and using electronic medical records.

### Medical Office Professional

## Mo-Th, 5:45 - 9 pm

Attending the Introduction is required before registering into any EL class. Learn about course offerings throughout Grossmont Adult Education (including high school completion options and career training), financial, academic, and other supports, and job preparation opportunities. You will also learn and implement digital literacy skills.

## STEP 2: COMPLETE AN ASSESSMENT

During the mandatory "Introduction to EL," you will complete a reading, listening, writing, and speaking assessment. The assessment is a component of your placement into the recommended class and will help you gain English language skills effectively.

## English Basics (Literacy)

Become familiar with the English alphabet and acquire basic reading and writing skills, including learning basic word and phrase grammar. The level is appropriate for anyone who cannot read in her or his first language or never had the chance to go to school.

## English Level 1 (Beginning Lit)

Gain the skills to maintain simple daily interactions and communicate basic ideas in English, learn to ask and answer simple questions, and read and write short, basic sentences in English.

## English Level 2 (Beginning Low)




